



Step 1

Registration Module 1

- Register for Medication Assisted Treatment for Opioid Dependence (MATOD) via the [RACGP events page](#).
- Your registration for will be approved with links provided by the RACGP.

Complete Module 1: Safer Opioid Prescribing

- This module will take two hours to complete.

Complete Module 1 assessment

- You will receive feedback on your assessment via email.

Step 2

Register Module 2

- You will receive an email inviting you to register for Module 2.
- Your registration will be approved with links provided by the RACGP.

Complete the predisposing activity

- The predisposing activity will take 45 minutes to complete.

Step 3

Begin Module 2

- In this section, you will need to complete:
 - Part A Setting the Scene
 - Part B Opioid Use Disorder – DSM-5 Criteria
- This section will take 1.5 hours to complete.

Attend the online role-play session (via Zoom)

- Register for your preferred session using the links provided by the RACGP.
- This role-play will take 30 minutes to complete.

Continue Module 2

- In this section, you will need complete Part C: Pharmacology and Dosing.
- This section will take one hour to complete.

Complete Module 2 assessment

- You will receive feedback on your assessment via email.

Step 4

Attend your one-on-one feedback webinar

- This webinar will summarise key messages from the program and allow you to ask the MATOD experts any final questions.
- This conversation will take 15 minutes.

Complete your reinforcing activity and book your feedback webinar

- The reinforcing activity will take 15 minutes to complete.

Complete the evaluation survey

- You will receive links to complete the evaluation survey.

Receive a clinic visit from the Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS) and a Pharmacotherapy Area-Based Network manager (PABN)

- After you complete the program, you will be contacted by DHHS and your local PABN manager to arrange receipt of your copy of the Victorian Policy for maintenance pharmacotherapy for opioid dependence and other resources to support you as new prescriber for opioid-dependant people in your local community.
